



Sort your waste correctly

Collected by the garbage truck

Brown waste bin

Compost household waste

You shall put all that can be composted in the brown bin. For example, food waste, egg shells, and small bones. Fruit, bread, coffee grounds and napkins/household paper. This is placed in a biodegradable paper bag that will be thrown in the brown bin. Mix with paper towels or add one newspaper page at the bottom if it gets too wet.



To avoid bad smell, you can pack fish-guts and other smelly waste in newspaper before throwing it in the brown bin.

Green waste bin

Residual waste

Residual waste is collected in a optional plastic bag and thrown in the green bin. For example dishcloths, vacuum cleaner bags, diapers, bandages, swabs, patches, sticky packaging such as sticky meat or bacon bag packages. Stockings, sneakers, envelopes, post-it notes, pens, cat litter, etc.



*Note! No glass, metal, hard- soft plastic, newspapers, batteries, light bulbs or electrical waste are allowed in the green bin.
The goal is to produce as little residual waste as possible!*

Blue bucket

Here is minor things that can not be sorted in any other faction. Like flower pots made of clay or porcelain, steel wool, porcelain plate and cups.

Note! No metal cans, light-bulbs or batteries in the blue bucket.



How to sort your recycling at the recycling station

Glass packaging

Separate glass made from coloured or clear glass

Note! Recycle bottles that have a deposit payed on them for refund. Light bulbs shall be recycled at the recycling center.



Metal packaging

E.g tin cans, empty spray cans, bottles, aluminium foil.

Rinse the package. Leave the lid on the tubes.



Plastic packaging

E.g bottles, bags, refill packages, plastic tubes, plastic wrapping.

Recycle hard and soft plastic packagings.



Paper packaging

E.g empty bags of sugar, pasta boxes, wrapping paper, milk and juice cartons, shoe boxes, empty toilet rolls.

Rinse, flatten and fold the packages.



Newspapers

E.g Daily papers, magazines, catalogues, brochures

Note! No envelopes and post-its shall be thrown in the regular household waste.



Recycling centres

Electricity

Everything that is powered by cored or batteries.

E.g energy saving lamps, fluorescent lamps, clocks, televisions, mobile phones, cookers, fridge and freezer.



Hazardous waste

Seal the container tightly and label it with the content or enter "unknown" if you do not know.

E.g paint, solvents, varnishes, adhesives, oil, petroleum, asbestos.



Batteries

Batteries contain a number of heavy metals and toxic chemicals.

E.g Lead-acid batteries, silver oxide batteries, lithium ion batteries.



Scrap metal

All metal that's not a package.

E.g pots, tea lights, tools, bicycles, gutters, rainwater pipes and lawnmowers.



Bulky objects

Big objects like furnitures, kitchenware and building insulation.

Sorted objects are free of charge.



Garden waste

E.g. leaves, grass and branches

Note! No plastic bags in the garden waste



Wood waste

Sort clean wood and impregnated wood separately.

E.g. wood, wooden furniture, pallets, sleepers.



The most important thing is that you leave hazardous waste at the recycling center.

Reduce your amount of garbage by avoiding disposable items.

Do not use extra hot water and detergent to clean the packaging. Instead, rinse with cold water or wash out when you wash your regular wash.

Fold and flatten to reduce the volume and therefore transport.
